✦ Here we are, sharing in small groups during our student fellowship meeting.





### Thanksgiving:

- 1. Even though it was a busy December, thank you for making time to pray for me. We hosted multiple student parties at our apartment for a total of about 30 students who came over, 2 of whom decided to believe in Jesus! These parties were a chance for us to challenge our Christian students to practice sharing the gospel. I was very encouraged by the many good responses from our non-Christian students.
- 2. I started a Bible study at Rithmeikan University in November. During the Christmas season we had a meal together and it was the first time that I invited the students to pray with me, and they responded quite well.

◆ We invited a number of overseas Chinese students to our home for a year end meal.

- 3. In December, I was invited to an event at a Christian physical and mental health organization. I taught these Japanese people how to make Taiwanese food, and in the process I was able to share my faith with the patients there as well as the government official who hosted the event. The Christian worker at the health organization told me that this was the first time in many years of working there that he was able to see someone testify freely at a public event and he was quite excited. I felt thankful that I was able to share the gospel while teaching culinary art. It was great to meet lots of different kinds of Japanese people there who came from different life stages and had different needs.
- 4. My Japanese teacher, Chiaki, recently introduced a mother to the Lord. Last year, my teacher's son was bullied and she chose to forgive and not pursue further punishment for his attackers. One of the mothers of the bullies was very touched by her forgiveness and started studying the Bible with my teacher. Recently, she decided to follow Jesus and has been going to church regularly. I've been so thankful to be able to pray regularly with my teacher and see God answer our prayers!
- ◆ Our Osaka University gospel choir was invited to perform at a small event. Even though we are not professional singers, everyone gave it their all. Please pray that Koutaro (the guy on the right) and Ayaka (the girl next to him) would know Jesus soon.
- ♦ Seiko, (rightmost) a graduate from a university in Tokyo, brought a younger Christian friend, whom she's mentoring, to visit me in Osaka. We used to spend a lot of time mentoring her and now that I see that she is caring for someone else, I was filled with joy.
