Dear brothers and sisters in the Lord,

Last month, I had the opportunity to meet with several cross-cultural missionaries. We were all around the same age, all single, and all in the process of learning new languages and adjusting to new cultures. The people groups we were ministering to were all groups with a low number of Christians. It's hard for all of us to use "results," especially numbers to measure our impact because these people groups are resistant towards the gospel. As for where we are all serving, some of us serve highly persecuted areas, others in extreme spiritual battlegrounds, and some are in areas where as soon as you mention "religion" you will be ostracized by society. We shared our difficulties and struggles on the field, the loneliness that no one else understands, and our prayers that the global church will recognize the needs of these people groups. Though our conversations were unexpected, I was extremely comforted and encouraged by these talks. Sometimes it is lonely serving in a cross-cultural context, but having companions who listen, and the prayers of brothers and sisters, is the best kind of companionship. Most importantly, our omniscient God always understands our hearts. Thank you so much for your prayers and support!

Please especially pray for my sleep, I don't sleep well when I'm out in a team setting, and I will need the Lord's grace to make it through.
 - 5. For this trip, I still need to raise 46,000 JPY (about 12,700 TWD or \$421) in order to cover our evangelistic event supplies, transportation, meals and housing expenses, etc. May the Lord provide.
